3.1 Report out: January 11, 2024 IAEC Steering Committee: Dr. Emma Diaz presented

- The IAE Consortium held a Steering Committee on January 11, 2024. Each site administrators, principals and director for the county office attended and discussed new CAEP updates. The main topic was data collection logistics. It was decided that we should hold a meeting to discuss how everyone is collecting and reporting data, and determine what kind of training and professional development is needed. The County Office of Education will host a Data Mining meeting on February 2nd for the IAE Consortium.
- IAE Consortium’s annual plan retreat will be on May 29, 2024 at the Inland Career Education Center.
- IAEC’s Super Consortia PD Day will be on August 1, 2024 at the Inland Career Education Center.
- Crafton and Valley plan to hold an Open House during the first week of April.

3.2 2023-2024 Q1 Student Data: Dr. Emma Diaz presented

- The deadline for Q2 is January 31, 2024. It seems that everyone is on track to exceed last year's Q4 performance by Q2 of this year. This information is consistent with the reports in TOPSPro.
- IAEC has an average higher than state averages for transition, indicating successful completion of adult programs and transfer to college-level classes.

- The data shows a progression from one counselor to a total of four counselors. One full time at Crafton and three at Valley College. We have developed our own system to track this success, which demonstrates the return on investment of having four full-time counselors.

3. \$50,062 Salary per year: Add Nursing Assistant Teacher for IET-CNA program.
4. \$7,179 salary: Add 10 hours weekly for 10 weeks for two sessions for clinical and adult student coordination.
5. \$1,000 salary: Marketing for adult IET-CNA program.
6. \$2,200: Instructional supplies.
7. \$770: Consumable workbooks
8. \$400: Books used in class and during licensure testing.
9. \$800: Office supplies, miscellaneous, technology subscriptions for the classroom teacher.
10. \$100: Postage for mailing student applications to the state and for envelopes for testing results.

**SUBJECT: CAEP 2024-25 Preliminary Allocations**

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This memorandum advises local recipients and fiscal agents of the fiscal year (FY) 2024-25 Preliminary CAEP Allocations. CAEP Education Code Section 84909 mandates the release of the FY 2024-25 Preliminary Allocations for each consortium, which includes an additional \$4.911M COLA. The COLA re-benchs the total annual statewide CAEP appropriation for future years to \$651,133,000.

The first step of this process is the release of the annual preliminary allocations schedule. To view the FY 2024-25 Preliminary CAEP Allocations schedule, [click here](#). The second step requires the CAEP consortia and their members to submit their Consortium Fiscal Administration Declaration (CFAD) via the NOVA system no later than **5:00 PM on May 2, 2024**. The CFAD captures member allocations for each consortium as well as the consortium's chosen disbursement method. The CAEP State Office uses the information from the CFAD process to determine the payment schedules for the disbursement of CAEP funding. There will be no extensions granted for the May 2nd due date.

Please note that the CFAD includes AB 1491 carryover compliance implementation questions that requests the consortium to identify how it will be addressing this statute. This new statute includes consortia-defined excess member carryover and the process by which consortia will offer technical assistance and/or reasonable intervention to its members prior if making a finding of excessive member carryover. All this information must be included in the certified CFAD. For additional information, you may access the [AB 1491 CAEP policy guidance](#).

All CAEP members are eligible for the COLA. Please see Education Code Section 84914 governing an increase or decrease of CAEP funding from the prior year. Consortia cannot vote to exclude or prevent a member from receiving a COLA, provided that the member received funding in the prior year. However, after the CFAD is submitted, consortia can use the

allocation amendment process in NOVA to move CAEP funds based on consortia agreed upon by-laws.
