3.1 2025-2028 Three-Year Planning Process – No NOVA Template Open Until May, Dr. Emma Diaz presented:

- The State has notified us that Nova templates will not be open until May after the certification of the CFAD.
- During the workshop at Valley College, Becky led a consensus session where we reviewed last year's strategies.
- Attendees included members from all the districts, several community members, and representatives from libraries and workforce development.
- We worked together to create a 3-year plan due on June 20th, which requires your approval in NOVA.

- Today is the deadline for Q2 student data submission
- In the school year 2022-2023, we ended the year with 7,448 students, and in 2023-2024, we served over 9,000 students in adult education.
- In the past we could carry over 40% and now with the implementation of AB1491 we are only able to carry 20% as an individual school and as a consortium. As a consortium, we had a 16% carryover, which kept it under the radar for the State. The last column reflects the total operating budget for this year.
- The data does not include the college student data.

- In K-12 education, enrollment in programs is important, while in college, the focus is on transition data. In 2018, we hired a transition counselor and began tracking this data.
- SBVC has 3 transition counselors and Crafton has 1 transition counselor.
- The goal of AB104 is either post-secondary transition or workforce connection.
- The transition counselors provide services such as enrollment, referrals to the county, and connections to job or workforce programs.
- Dr. Ed D’Souza requested the enrolled students in SBVC and Crafton data by district.

- 2023-2024 COLA held with fiscal was \$240,594, for the 2024-2025 COLA held with fiscal was \$137,798 which brings our total on hold at \$378, 392.
- We have two requests and one item to vote on. If all three requests are approved, we do not have the funds to cover them all.

4. Discussion Items

- 4.1 Rialto Adult School Request for a total of \$343,000
 - Certificated Teacher Salary increases & Benefits – \$290,000
 - Cost for Online licenses, books, materials, and technology – \$53,000
 - Kim Watson informed the attending members that in the past 4 years, Rialto has not received COLA funds and that in the past five years’ salary increased by almost 20%. The teachers are now members of the union and are receiving step increases in their salaries.
- 4.2 Colton Adult School Request for a total of \$97,851
 - Cost of 6% salary increases in 2024-25. \$34,357 (One-time COL funding)
 - Cost of 6% salary increases in 2024-25. \$63,494 (Ongoing Funding)

- Angela Hatter informed the attending members that they have been impacted by a 6% salary increase ongoing and retroactive for the certificated and classified staff.
- It is necessary to conduct a more detailed examination of the fairness in the distribution of resources as a safeguard against negative budget outcomes.
- It was proposed that we move forward by either implementing or analyzing the existing models utilized by other consortia. Additionally, it was recommended to adopt a multi-data approach for gathering and evaluating outcome data to review the efficacy of programs in place.
- All districts announced the salary increases they expect for their staff.
- A sub-committee was formed to suggest markers for the fund process request in the future. They will bring back criteria and process to the executive member to review. The sub-committee will be made up of the Steering committee, Ms. Cali Binks, Dr. Carol Tsushima, and Dr. Kevin Horan. They will meet before Feb. 28th, next executive meeting.
